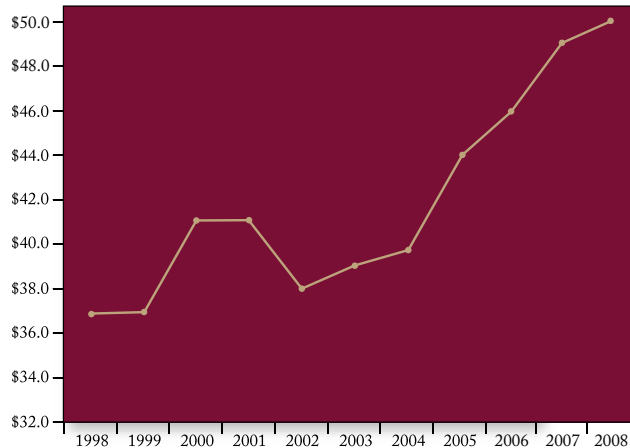

DESCRIPTION OF SURVEY SAMPLE

In October 2008, 1032 surveys were mailed to December 2007 and May 2008 graduates of the Farmer School of Business. We received 169 responses, or 16 percent. Of the respondents, 28 percent were marketing majors, 27 percent were finance majors, 19 percent were accountancy majors, and 7 percent were economics majors. The remainder, 19 percent, represented the other majors.

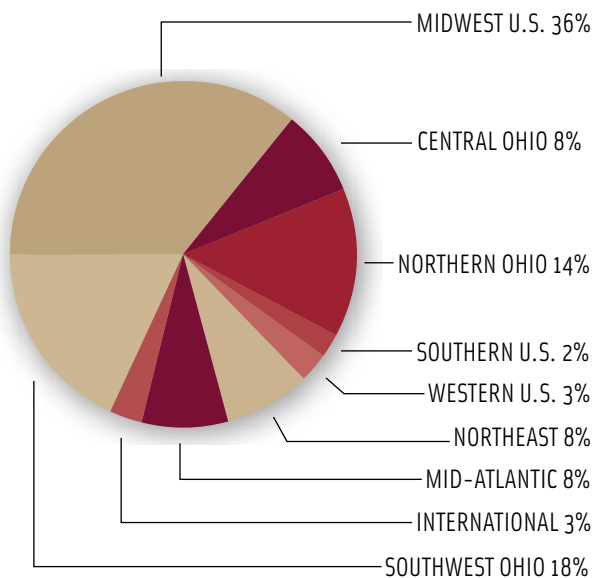
